

**LIST OF CONDITIONS -PROPOSED COASTAL IMPROVEMENT WORKS FOR
CONTROLLING SEVERE BEACH EROSION AT BALACLAVA BY BLUE OCEAN
PARK LTD (ENV/DOE/EIA/1592)**

1. All other necessary permits/clearances from the relevant authorities shall be obtained and all the conditions attached therewith shall be scrupulously observed. A copy of all the permits/clearances obtained shall be submitted to the Director of Environment.
2. The development shall be undertaken as per the mitigating measures stated in the EIA report and the additional information unless as otherwise advised herein.
3. The Department of Environment of the Ministry of Environment and Sustainable Development and the Ministry of Fisheries shall be informed in writing of the date of commencement of works for monitoring purposes. A detailed programme of works and implementation plans shall be submitted to the Department of Environment, Ministry of Environment and Sustainable Development and the Ministry of Fisheries for approval prior to the start of works. The proponent shall inform these ministries of any change in the work plan in advance.
4. In accordance with section 18(2)(i) of the Environment Protection Act 2002, the proponent shall submit to the Director of Environment an Environmental Monitoring Plan for approval prior to start of works. The proponent shall thereafter submit reports on the implementation accordingly.
5. The Department of Environment shall be informed in writing of the date of completion of all works on site for monitoring purposes and to ensure compliance with the conditions of the EIA Licence.
6. Since this undertaking is within the boundaries of the Balaclava Marine Park and the locations at which the proposed beach anchors would be placed are at an average distance of 40 metres from the actual HWM, no machine shall have access into the sea during the work as it would have severe impact on the marine ecosystem. All work to be carried out manually.

7. Double layered Geotextile screen of appropriate mesh size shall be properly placed and anchored all around the site of work at sea in order to protect the adjoining lagoon areas from any entrainment of sediment plumes and they shall be regularly maintained.
8. After the completion of the proposed works, all used Geotextile screens shall be removed and disposed of at an approved disposal site.
9. All live benthic organisms shall be carefully handpicked and transferred from the project site to safer areas in the lagoon in the presence of a Fisheries Officer before the start of lagoon works.
10. All imported rocks boulders shall be properly cleaned/washed of any soil/material before entering the project site to prevent any entrainment of additional soil and other material to the Balaclava Marine Park.
11. No waste shall be allowed in the lagoon, all lagoon works shall be carried out during daytime only and at low tide.
12. Necessary clearances shall be obtained from the Prime Minister's Office for the beach re- profiling works since this will involve the modification of the shoreline.
13. Prior to starting of work the promoter shall apply for an *Interference Permit* and pay the appropriate fees for each structure to be placed in the Balaclava Marine Park according to the Fisheries and Marine Resources Act (Marine Protected Areas Regulations 2001).
14. The promoter shall monitor the state of the marine environment including the current patterns after the implementation of the project on a monthly basis for the first year and eventually on a quarterly basis for the next three years. The reports shall be submitted to the Ministry of Environment and SD and the Ministry of Fisheries.
15. The public shall have unrestricted access to the beach, jetty and swimming zone.
16. The promoter shall hold consultative meetings with the coastal users of the region especially the fishermen community and copies of the notes of meetings sent to the Ministry of Fisheries and the Ministry of Environment and

Sustainable Development. The Ministry of Fisheries may provide a list of registered fishermen in the region.

17. No works shall be carried out in case of bad weather.
18. The promoter shall comply with the Marine Protected Areas Regulations 2001 under the Fisheries and Marine Resources Act.
19. The design of the beach anchors shall be as specified in the EIA document.
20. The proponent shall adhere to the Fisheries and Marine Resources (Marine Protected Areas) Regulations 2001.
21. The site of works shall be carefully delineated such that no beach anchors are placed at less than 5m from the coral growth line.
22. All rubbles that are supportive of live coral shall be manually and carefully displaced in an appropriate locality for their growth.
23. The execution of the works shall not cause any noise nuisance to the public and the surrounding environment.
24. No dredging shall be undertaken under this EIA.
25. It shall be the duty of the proponent to protect the marine environment with all its ecological assets to the satisfaction of the Ministry of Environment and SD and the Ministry of Fisheries.
26. If during the implementation of the project, any environment problem or negative impact ensues, the proponent shall accordingly inform the Ministry of Environment and SD immediately and shall redress the harm caused at its own cost and to the complete satisfaction of the Ministry of Environment and SD and the Ministry of Fisheries.
27. Any proposed deviation shall be subject to an application to the Director of Environment. No deviation or part thereof shall be executed prior to the determination of the application by the Director.
