

**LIST OF CONDITIONS - PROPOSED EXPANSION OF THE EXISTING FISH FARMING ACTIVITIES AT ANSE JONCHÉE BY FERME MARINE DE MAHEBOURG (ENV/DOE/EIA/1610)**

1. All other necessary permits/clearances from the relevant authorities, including a Concession from the Prime Minister's Office shall be obtained and all the conditions attached therewith shall be scrupulously observed. A copy of all the permits/clearances obtained shall be submitted to the Director of Environment.
2. The development shall be undertaken as per the mitigating measures stated in the EIA report and the additional information submitted unless as otherwise advised herein.
3. The Department of Environment shall be informed in writing of the date of commencement of works for monitoring purposes. A detailed programme of work shall be submitted to the Department of Environment, Ministry of Environment & Sustainable Development and the Ministry of Fisheries, prior to the start of works.
4. In accordance with section 18(2)(l) of the Environment Protection Act 2002, the proponent shall submit to the Director of Environment, Ministry of Environment & SD with copy to the Ministry of Fisheries, an Environmental Monitoring Plan for approval prior to start of works. The proponent shall thereafter submit reports on the implementation accordingly. The Environmental Monitoring Plan shall contain the baseline data on the state of the marine environment at the project site. The proponent shall monitor the state of the marine environment including lagoon water quality after the implementation of the project on a 3 months basis for the first year of operation and thereafter, as determined by the Director, Department of Environment, Ministry of Environment & Sustainable Development.
5. During the construction of the fish farms in the lagoon, the work zones and the adjoining sites shall be delineated and screened with geo-textile screen of appropriate mesh size, installed in double layers in the lagoon and regularly maintained in order to protect the adjoining lagoon areas from sediment entrainment.

6. The fish farming activities shall be carried out as per the requirements and recommendations of the Competent Authority-Seafood.
7. The proponent shall take all necessary measures to ensure that the introduction of fish species does not have any irreversible impacts on the marine environment and its ecosystem.
8. The fish farming sites shall be demarcated by buoys that are an aid to navigation. The expansion of the farm shall not interfere with the activities of fishermen and pleasure crafts of the area.
9. No debris or wastewater of any type shall have access to the sea.
10. Any dead fish shall be disposed of as per the recommendations of the Competent Authority- Seafood.
11. A contingency plan for any accidental oil spill from boats servicing the fish farms shall be prepared as stipulated under section 30 (3) of the Environmental Protection Act and shall be submitted to the Director of Environment.
12. The proponent shall construct a drain with metal grating at the entrance of the access road of land based activities to avoid gravels / rocks and surface runoff to flow on the main road. The proponent shall also liaise with Traffic Management & Road Safety Unit to fix appropriate traffic sign to prevent accident.
13. The proponent shall hold consultative/ informative meetings with the fishermen community of the region and other coastal users and shall resolve any conflict that may arise.
14. Necessary measures shall be taken during all the phases of the project, including site preparation, construction and operation so as not to cause any nuisance to the public and surrounding environment.

15. Any proposed deviation shall be subject to an application to the Director of Environment. No deviation or part thereof shall be executed prior to the determination of the application by the Director.
