# CCA and DRR evaluation • Need for more DRR • Few synergies are being exploited • Institution and policy maps and gaps – detailed review of four case study countries (Cook Islands, Fiji, Palau, Vanuatu) • Lessons from the Caribbean • Recommendations for greater integration

# Findings from four case study countries

Level of mainstreaming:

- DRR referenced in planning but little budgetary allowance, limited extension at local level
- CCA referenced, but very limited ability to reduce vulnerability

# Findings from four case study countries

Translation of policies and plans into programmes

- Very little practical implementation of DRR.
   NGO work effective but limited.
- Limited translation of CCA to sectors and communities. At local level much of work is being undertaken outside conventional national planning and budgetary processes.

## Findings from four case study countries

Institutional arrangements

- Excellent DRM arrangements in theory that often fall down in practice – poor communication
- Climate change seen as an environmental issue with Ministry for Environment taking the lead.
   In some countries transferred to PMs office, but no additional resources

## Findings from four case study countries

Level of integration of DRR and CCA

- Low level integration with little happening on the ground
- Tonga has developed an integrated plan for DRR and CCA
- Proof of its effectiveness will be in the implementation

- Learn from past experience
- Include those most affected
- In harmony with community
- Outside support
- Enhance peoples capacity to act (not victims)
- Draw on participatory development activities
- Simple and user-friendly M&E
- Local champions used to mobilise communities
- · Empowerment of local community
