Restricted Areas in the South East Region

Reference is made to Operation Order No. 21/2020 dated 7 August 2020 on the above subject.

2. As you are aware, other coastal areas have been affected by the oil spilling caused by the Wakashio shipwreck. As such, General Notice No. 1104 of 2020 issued on 7 August 2020 has been revoked and replaced by General Notice 1148 Of 2020 issued on 10 August 2020 where additional affected coastal areas have been declared as restricted areas in the interest of public safety and public security.(copy is annexed)

3. Hereunder are the areas which have been declared as restricted areas. Hence, access is to be controlled and only authorized persons are to be allowed thereto.

- (i) The Lagoon region from Bois des Amourettes Jetty along an imaginary line up to Le Chaland;
- (ii) Pointe D'Esny;
- (iii) Pointe Vacoas;
- (iv) Pointe Jerome;
- (v) Blue Bay Marine Park;
- (vi) Pointe Brocus;
- (vii) Falaise Rouge up to Mahebourg Waterfront;
- (viii) Riviere des Creoles public beach;
- (ix) Anse Jonchee;
- (x) Bambous Virieux;
- (xi) Pointe du Diable;
- (xii) Grand Sable;
- (xiii) Pointe aux Feuilles;
- (xiv) Quatre Soeurs;
- (xv) Deux Freres;
- (xvi) Grand River South East;
- (xvii) Ile aux Cerfs;
- (xvii) Ilot Mangenie; and,
- (xviii) Trou D' Eau Douce.

3. Besides ensuring the smooth salvage and skimming operations and the cleaning of the affected coastal areas, the Police are to control access in the abovementioned areas and increase vigilance to prevent any other incident.

General Notice No. 1148 of 2020

THE NATIONAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT ACT

**Order made by the National Crisis Committee under section 16(2) of
the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act**

1. WHEREAS the motor vessel *Wakashio* of Panama flag ran aground off Pointe D'Esny on 25 July, 2020, at 19 31 hours local time, and has currently developed cracks which has resulted in an oil spill.
2. NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to section 16(2) of the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act, the National Crisis Committee, after consultation with the Prime Minister, is hereby ordering –
 - (a) that no unauthorised person shall venture in the restricted areas specified in the Appendix or in any such other area as the National Crisis Committee may deem necessary;
 - (b) the closure of any places as the National Crisis Committee may deem necessary.
3. The Public is hereby informed that the National Emergency Operations Command will coordinate and monitor all response and recovery activities and it shall have such powers as may be necessary to discharge its functions.
4. Members of the public are hereby reminded that where a person refuses to evacuate any restricted area, a police officer may use such reasonable force as may be necessary to remove that person from that area.
5. Any person who contravenes this Order or any direction of the National Emergency Operations Command shall commit an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding 100,000 rupees and to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 years.
6. General Notice No. 1104 of 2020 is hereby revoked.
